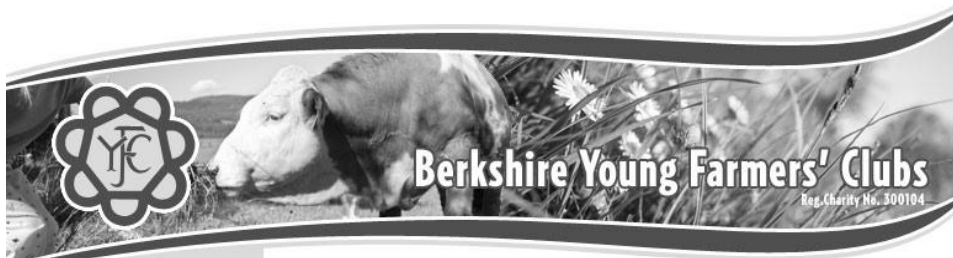

County Fayre Show Class Rules

1. Competitors must be paid up members of Berkshire Federation of YFC and must not represent more than one club in the show. Judges may ask to see YFC membership cards, failure to present a valid membership upon request will result in penalty as a non entry (see rule 5).

2. Competitor eligibility is defined as per National membership guidelines for 2009 – 2010; Junior; Members aged 16 years and under on 1st September 2009 Intermediate; Members aged 21 years and under on 1st September 2009 Senior; Members aged 26 years and under on 1st September 2009. All will be able to compete in the National Competition finals in the following year.

3. All entry forms must be sent to the Show Secretary by 26th April 2010 together with an alphabetical list of competitors and their membership numbers.

4. All entries will gain points that go towards their club totals. All individual entries will gain points that go towards their individual totals and the club totals. Points earned in team events and the co-operative/floats will go towards the club totals.

5. Clubs will be penalised if they do not enter classes as stated on the entry forms unless they have been notified to the Show Secretary by 30th May. Deduction of points for non-entry will be:

Individual Class	15 points
Team Class	30points
Co-operative	75 points

6. Practical classes; only the competitors must book in, in person and attempt to take part in the class. If this has been done, then the loss of points is at the discretion of the judge/ chief steward.

7. Substitute entries will be allowed for all classes providing the competitor presents the appropriate form to the steward before the competition commences. Clubs will be given substitute forms before the show.

8. Clubs may enter a maximum of 3 competitors in each class unless otherwise stated in the rules or entry form. Individual competitors may enter as many classes as they wish.

9. Scoring; the County rules apply.

10. Competitors must receive no assistance in classes unless directed by the judge. Judges, Stewards and Scorers will be given guidelines.

11. The Judges decision is accepted as final and binding. Any complaint should be made in writing to the Secretary accompanied by a £10 deposit. This money will be returned if the complaint is upheld. **No competitor, parent or member of the public may approach a Judge directly.**

12. Any competitors not complying with the requirements of a class or rules of the competition (e.g. size of exhibit) will be disqualified.
13. A timetable of practical classes will be forwarded to each Club before the County Show. All competitors are to report to the competition site ten minutes before start time of the class. Competitors failing to report will possibly lose points. Please send a message to the class steward if you are detained by another class elsewhere on the showground.
14. Competitors in Machinery classes must wear overalls and competitors in Stock judging must wear white coats.
15. All items for exhibition classes must be in place by 9.00am for judging to commence at 9.15am. Nobody except officials to be in the tent when judging is taking place.
16. Items must not be removed before 4.30pm. If competitors remove entries before this time, the club will be penalised as a non entry (see rule 5).
17. No exhibit can have been displayed at a previous show and all must be unaided work of the competitor.
18. All foodstuffs **must** be suitably covered. Taste and appearance at time of judging will be taken into consideration.
19. All articles must be labelled on postcards as follows:
On the **visible/top** side—Class Number & Competitor Number (see note)
On the bottom side—Name of the Club, Name of Competitor & Age Group
Post cards **must be secured** to the exhibit or to the table beside exhibit. Drawing pins or selotape must be supplied by competitor.
- Note: Every Berkshire member on the County database will be given a personal competitor number. This number is to be used on the postcards and will be sent to clubs shortly after the class entry closing date. Competitors over club age will also have numbers allocated and sent to their respective clubs. Judges will have separate cards to use for their comments.

21. Clubs must specify if they intend to enter as an Open Club or as a Junior and Senior Clubs at the County AGM.

GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR COMPETITORS, JUDGES AND STEWARDS

1. Classes 1 - 12 are open to nominations by the County Federations of the South East Area and individuals.
2. Normal YFC judging and procedure will be followed. All competitions are governed by the rules of the National Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs National Competitions Programme - www.nfyfc.org.uk/competitions.html. The judges' decisions are final. Unless otherwise stated: Senior competitors must be aged 26 or under on 1st September 2009
Intermediate competitors must be aged 21 or under on 1st September 2009
Junior competitors must be aged 16 or under on 1st September 2009.

Consent forms must be presented for competitors under the age of 18 who are taking part in competitions on the Saturday of the show.

3. ENTRIES CLOSE ON FRIDAY 19th MARCH 2010. Clubs should liaise with their County Staff regarding County team classes. County Federations must submit their entries and individual Clubs must submit the number of entries they wish to make in each class, together with entry fees in full (inclusive of VAT) with cheques payable to SEAS. All entries are to be sent to **SEAS YFC Administrator, Mrs S Blake, Tott Farm, Hurstpierpoint, West Sussex, BN6 9QW. Tel: 01273 834318, Mobile: 07914 254905**
At this stage County team member names need not be stated.

4. The SEAS YFC committee reserves the right to cancel any class unless three or more entries are received, except where this forms part of an eliminating competition, also to vary any condition or competition in any way it or stewards consider desirable or necessary.

5. Exhibits or craft items must have been prepared during the past year and **will not be accepted unless accompanied by a label clearly stating exhibitors name, County and Class number.**

6. Neither the YFC stewards nor the South of England Agricultural Society can be responsible for the loss or damage to exhibits whilst on the showground, but every care will be taken to avoid such loss or damage.

7. Those competing on Saturday **must** book in, in person, for all stock judging no later than 30 minutes before the competition. It is advisable to book in early and this can be done between 7.45am and 10am.

8. All exhibits **must remain** in the YFC building until after the presentation of prizes. Any non-perishable exhibits that are left at the show will be kept for one month by the host County and then destroyed.

9. **All competitors are expected to stay for the presentation of prizes in the YFC building on the show Saturday at 4.30pm whether or not they have won. All YFC members should be fully clothed, preferably in club shirts.**

10. Any competitors not taking part in a competition must return their tickets to SEAS YFC Administrator Mrs S Blake by **Monday 21st June 2010.**

- a) A team shall consist of 8 pulling members. A maximum of two members of that team may be between the ages of 15 and 18 years on 1st September in 2009 and the remainder of the team must be over 18 years but 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2009. All competitors must be full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.
 - b) Each County may enter as many teams as South East Area rules permit.
 - c) No substitutes can be permitted once the team has pulled in the competition.
 - d) A coach and a trainer, who must be amateurs under TOWA laws, are allowed but need not comply with YFC age limits.
 - e) All competitors (male and female) must be suitably dressed in Tug of War boots, shorts and shirts. The shirts in each team to be of the same colour. Failure to comply will lead to disqualification.
- All rules are NFYFC rules.

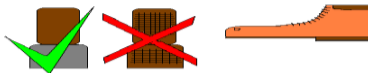

Class 15 – CLUB EXHIBIT – one entry per Club permitted.

Each Exhibit to depict the theme of “My Home County”. Each whole Exhibit to have a MAXIMUM WIDTH of 1 metre at any given point and a MAXIMUM DEPTH of 1 metre and MAXIMUM HEIGHT of 1 metre. Each exhibit to include one each of the following 5 items:

Floral Arrangement, A diary of a typical club meeting, A club mascot

A trophy made out of predominantly recycled material, A photograph depicting life in your club

Extra items may be included to enhance the exhibit but only 1 sample of each of the specified 5 items are to be used. (i.e. 1 club mascot only, 1 trophy only etc).
