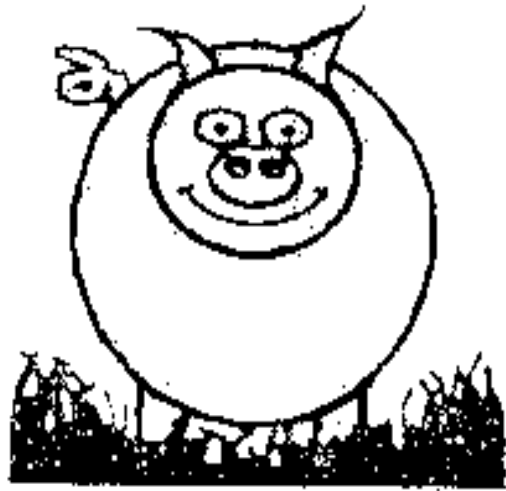

County Fayre Show Class Rules 2012

1. Competitors must be paid up members of Berkshire Federation of YFC and must not represent more than one club in the show. Judges may ask to see YFC membership cards, failure to present a valid membership upon request will result in penalty as a non entry (see rule 5).
2. Competitor eligibility is defined as per National membership guidelines for 2011 – 2012; Junior; members aged 16 years and under on 1st September 2011. Intermediate; members aged 21 years and under on 1st September 2011. Senior; members aged 26 years and under on 1st September 2011. All will be able to compete in the National Competition finals in the following year.
3. All entry forms must be sent to the Show Secretary by 20th April 2012, together with an alphabetical list of competitors and their membership numbers.
4. All entries will gain points that go towards their club totals. All individual entries will gain points that go towards their individual totals and the club totals. Points earned in team events and the co-operative/floats will go towards the club totals.
5. Clubs will be penalised if they do not physically enter classes as stated on their entry form, unless withdrawals have been notified to the Show Secretary by 18th May. Deduction of points for non-entry will be:

Individual Class	15 points.
Team Class	30 points.
Co-operative	75 points.
6. Practical classes; only the competitors may book in, in person and attempt to take part in the class. If this has been done, then the loss of points is at the discretion of the judge/ chief steward.
7. Substitute entries will be allowed for all classes providing the competitor presents the appropriate form to the steward before the competition commences. Clubs will be given substitute forms before the show.
8. Clubs may enter a maximum of 3 competitors in each class unless otherwise stated in the rules or entry form. Individual competitors may enter as many classes as they wish.
9. Scoring; the County rules apply – available on request, recently reviewed by the County Executive committee.
10. Competitors must receive no assistance in classes unless directed by the judge. Judges, Stewards and Scorers will be given guidelines.
11. The Judges decision is accepted as final and binding. Any complaint should be made in writing to the Secretary accompanied by a £10 deposit. This money will be returned if the complaint is upheld. **No competitor, parent or member of the public may approach a Judge directly. Submission of entry forms is an acceptance of this condition.**

12. Any competitors not complying with the requirements of a class or rules of the competition (e.g. size of exhibit) will be disqualified.

13. A timetable of practical classes will be forwarded to each Club before the County Show. All competitors are to report to the competition site ten minutes before start time of the class. Competitors failing to report will possibly lose points. Please send a message to the class steward if you are detained by another class elsewhere on the showground.

14. Competitors in Machinery classes must wear overalls and competitors in Stock judging must wear white coats. Competitors are expected to wear PPE in classes where applicable, e.g. safety boots.

15. All items for exhibition classes must be in place by 9.00am for judging to commence at 9.15am. Nobody except officials to be in the tent when judging is taking place.

16. Items must not be removed before 4.30pm. If competitors remove entries before this time, the club will be penalised as a non entry (see rule 5).

17. No exhibit can have been displayed at a previous show and all must be unaided work of the competitor.

18. All foodstuffs **must** be suitably covered. Taste and appearance at time of judging will be taken into consideration.

19. All articles must be labelled on postcards as follows:

i) On the **visible/top** side; the Class Number & Competitor Number (see note).

ii) On the **bottom** side; the name of the Club and Competitor and the Age Group.

Post cards **must be secured** to the exhibit **or** to the table beside exhibit. Drawing pins or selotape for this use must be supplied by competitor.

Note: Every Berkshire member on the County database will be given a personal competitor number. This number is to be used on the postcards and will be sent to clubs shortly after the class entry closing date. Competitors over club age will also have numbers allocated and sent to their respective clubs. Judges will have separate cards to use for their comments.

20. For scoring purposes clubs will be numbered as follows:

1. Bradfield 2. Newbury 3. Reading. 4. Shefford

21. Clubs must specify if they intend to enter as an Open Club or as a Junior and Senior Clubs at the County AGM.

22. The Show Committee reserves the right to alter the time or details of classes if considered necessary.

23. The Show Committee shall not be liable for a claim whatsoever in respect of injury to property and person however caused.

Berkshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs seeks to include the full membership in all its endeavours. Should a member require assistance to compete in any competitions due to disability (learning or physical), every effort will be made to ensure inclusion of the individual with dignity, respect and confidentiality. 1	NEP	Floral Art	A Basket to present to an Olympian – an exhibit composed of natural plant material to be displayed in a basket . The exhibit may be with or without accessories and must be contained within a space measuring 75cm wide x 60cm deep x unlimited height. To be viewed from all sides . Backboard not allowed. Time allowed, 1 hour. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES</i> .
2	NE	Design Board	Competitors are required to make a fashion board , depicting the national uniform for an Olympic team - suitable as National team wear at the Olympics opening ceremony parade. Max size A2 . <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES</i> .
3	NE	Art	Competitor to produce a piece of art in a graffiti style to depict the topic of the 'The Olympics'. The board must be not larger than A1 in size. Any materials. The design MUST be suitable for public display to a family audience. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES</i> .
4	E	Art	Competitor to design and produce a poster advertising the 2012 Olympics. Max size A3 .
5	E	Photography	Competitor to take and display one mounted/ framed photograph entitled "My Hero" with a brief description of why. Max size A4 including mount/ frame.
6	E	Computer design	Competitor to design a "Chariot" suitable for racing – two human pullers and single rider. Printed design, Max size A4 .
7	E	Creative Writing	Competitor to write a report as for a newspaper or newsletter, describing the Olympic Games 100m Final. Typed or hand written. Max size A4.
8	E	Craft	Competitor to make and display an Olympic medal. Any material/s. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.
9	E	Craft/ Needlework	Competitor to make and display a "Winners Sash". To be hung for display purposes.
10	E	Cookery	Competitor to make and display 3 picnic dishes suitable for a steward at an Olympic event. Max size 60cm x 60cm x 60cm.
11	PE	Cookery	A team of two to decorate a cake to the theme of the Olympics. Dummy cakes permissible, all materials to be supplied by team. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.
12	E	Flower Arranging	Competitor to make and display a flower arrangement using a pair of trainers. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 60cm height.
13	E	Horticulture	Competitor to make and/or grow a miniature garden in a seed tray. Max size 25cm x 45cm.
14	P	Identification	Competitor to identify TEN National Flags. Time allowed 10 mins
15	P	Novelty	Welly Wanging; under judges instruction, furthest welly wins.
16	P	Novelty	Team of two, one to dress the other as an ancient Greek Olympian, all materials to be supplied by team. Time allowed 15 mins.

17	P	Novelty	Team of four to complete obstacle course as directed by the judge. To be judged on fastest time, though heats may be run if enough entries.
18	E	Woodwork	Competitor to make and display a hedgehog box. Max size 45cm x 45cm x 45cm.
19	E	Metalwork	Competitor to make and display a coat hook suitable for the back of a door. Max size 20cm x 45 cm.
20	P	Machinery	Competitors, 13 yrs and over on the day of the competition, to drive a compact tractor round a prescribed course. Competitor must have prior experience; and will only compete upon producing a signed letter of permission from a parent or legal Guardian. Competitor must attend familiarisation training before the competition.

21	NEP	Floral Art	“Great Britain” – an exhibit composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space measuring 75cm wide x 60cm deep x unlimited height. To be viewed from front. Competitors own backboards allowed. Time allowed, 1 hour. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES.</i>
22	NE	Design Board	Competitors are required to make a fashion board, depicting the national uniform for an Olympic team - suitable as National team wear at the Olympics opening ceremony parade. Max size A2. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES.</i>
23	NE	Art	Competitor to produce a piece of art in a graffiti style to depict the topic of the ‘The Olympics’. The board must be not larger than A1 in size. Any materials. The design MUST be suitable for public display to a family audience. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES.</i>
24	E	Art/ Design	Competitor to design and illustrate a new Olympic mascot. Design features to be annotated. Max size A3.
25	E	Photography	Competitor to take and display three mounted/ framed photographs entitled “Champions”. Max size A3 including mount/ frame.
26	E	Computer design	Competitor to create a new Olympic Sport, illustrate and describe rules, kit and equipment. Max size A3.
27	E	Creative Writing	Competitor to write a report as for a newspaper or magazine describing an Olympic Games opening ceremony. To be typed. Max size A4.
28	E	Craft	Competitor to make and display a ‘trophy’ made from recycled materials. Max size 45cm x 45cm x unlimited height.
29	E	Craft/ Needlework	Competitor to make and display a “terribly British” cushion. Max size 60cm x 60cm x 60cm.

30	E	Cookery	Competitor to make and display three dishes as a suitable meal for an athlete in training. Display must include recipes and ingredients. Max size 60cm x 60cm.
31	PE	Cookery	Competitor to make and display a smoothie suitable for an athlete. Recipe and ingredients to be shown. Time allowed 10 mins. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.
32	E	Flower Arranging	Competitor to make and display a flower arrangement to the theme of "Team GB". Max size 60cm x 60cm x unlimited.
33	E	Horticulture	Competitor to design and plant a garden planter or pot to the theme "Red, White and Blue". Max size 100cm x 60cm x unlimited height.
34	P	Identification	Competitor to identify ten athletes from pictures (or part pictures). Time allowed 10 mins.
35	P	Novelty	Welly Wanging; under judges instruction, furthest welly wins.
36	P	Novelty	Team of two, one to dress the other as an Olympic Team mascot, all materials to be supplied by team. Time allowed 15 mins.
37	P	Novelty	Team of four to complete obstacle course as directed by the judge. To be judged on fastest time, though heats may be run if enough entries.
38	E	Woodwork	Competitor to make and display a 'memory box' to store "2012". Max size 60cm x 60cm x 60cm.
39	E	Metalwork	Competitor to make and display an Olympic torch that can be used as a garden lantern (hung or freestanding). Max size 45cm x 45cm x unlimited height.
40	P	Machinery	Competitor to manoeuvre a late model tractor and attached trailer round a prescribed course. Make and model to be provided prior to competition. Valid driving license or tractor license to be shown on the day.

41	NEP	Floral Art	"A moment in Olympic history" – an exhibit composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space measuring 75cm wide X 60cm deep X unlimited height. To be viewed from front. Competitors own backboard allowed. Time allowed, 1 hour. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES.</i>
42	NE	Design Board	Competitors are required to make a fashion board, depicting the national uniform for an Olympic team - suitable as National team wear at the Olympics opening ceremony parade. Max size A2. <i>SEE NATIONAL RULES.</i>

46	E	Creative Writing	Competitor to write a promotional description of the London 2012 Olympic Park and venues. Must be typed. Max size A4.
47	E	Computer design	Competitor to create a printed advert for a new Energy drink. Max size A4.
48	E	Craft	Competitor to decorate a hat suitable for the Queen to wear at the Olympic Games. Max size 60cm x 60cm x 60cm.
49		Craft/ Needlework	Competitor to make and display a Country's pendant for the Olympics. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.
50	E	Cookery	Competitor to make and display the National dish of any Nation. Recipe and ingredients to be shown. Max size 45cm x 45cm x 45cm.
51	PE	Cookery	Competitor to make and display a celebratory cocktail including name and ingredients. Judge to taste. Max size 30cm x 30 cm x 45cm.
52	E	Flower arranging	Competitor to make and display a bouquet suitable for presentation to a medal winner at the Olympic games. Max size 75cm x 60cm x Unlimited height. Bouquet MUST be in water.
53	E	Horticulture	Competitor to plant a display a hanging basket to the theme "Red, White and Blue". To be hung. Max size 60cm x 60cm x unlimited.
54	P	Identification	Competitor to identify ten National anthems from recorded music. Time allowed ten minutes.
55	P	Novelty	Welly Wanging; under judges instruction, furthest welly wins
56	P	Novelty	Team of two, one to dress the other as a recognisable/ famous statue, all materials to be supplied by team. Time allowed 15 mins.

58	E	Woodwork	Competitor to make and display their own, portable seat/ stool for spectating at a sporting event. Max size; unlimited

62	E	Art	<p>Competitor to design the front cover for the 2012 2013 Berkshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs Yearbook. Competitor to be mindful of printing costs and constraints. Winning cover to be used for next yearbook. Computer aided work is acceptable. Size A5.</p>
63	NE	Craft	<p>Team of up to five, to produce an Exhibit to depict the theme of "Olympics". Exhibit to have Max Size 1m x 1m x 1m. The measurement will be taken from outside the square. The exhibits will be displayed on trestle tables. Each exhibit to include the following 5 items related to the theme:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Design and make an Olympic Medal inc Ribbon using any medium – suitable to be presented to a winning athlete. Any Olympic sport may be depicted 2. 79	E	Photography	Competitor to take and display three mounted/ framed photographs entitled "Caught in motion". Max size A3 including mount/ frame.
80	E	Cookery	Competitor to make and display a British Afternoon tea for two. Max size 60cm x 60cm x 60cm.
81	E	Cookery	Competitor to make and display a fruit cake to the recipe provided. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.

82	E	Needlework	Competitor to make and display a bag or holdall out of recycled materials. Unlimited size.
83	E	Flower arranging	Competitor to make and display a posy to give to the Queen. Max size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm.
